Small Groups on school campuses

This month, CCSD’s Board of School Trustees approved the Superintendent's recommendation that schools invite individual or small groups of students back to campus on a voluntary basis to participate in:

- Social-emotional wellness supports and interventions.
- Academic screenings, interventions and small-group instruction.

At this time there is not a set timeline for welcoming individual and small groups to school campuses. School administration will work with their campus communities to determine the best course of action. We understand that many families are looking forward to the time when all students can return to school campuses. When the time is appropriate, and with the consultation of medical professionals, we will work to make this possible and communicate it to all families.
